Popular sport

The students and the population are motivated to try out different winter sports and to incorporate sports activities into their everyday lives.

Top-class sports

The compatibility of top-class sport and studies is promoted. The Universiades are becoming important pillars in the career planning of top athletes.

Sports infrastructures

The competitions will be held in existing facilities. Renewals will be made sustainable and will have an effect beyond the year 2021. Temporary buildings will be constructed with restraint.

Fair play and anti-doping

All participants will be sensitized to fair play and anti-doping. The protection of minors is exemplary.

Financing and budget compliance

The event is concluded with a balanced invoice and the budget is adhered to.

Regional added value

Local providers will be considered for (accommodation and) meals for the participants.

Waste and Littering

The 3-R principle applies: re-duce, re-use, re-cycle: waste is avoided wherever possible, reused and disposed of properly.

Traffic and transport

Transports for people and material are kept as short as possible, coordinated and organised using the optimum means of transport. For the public and fans, travel by public transport is recommended / promoted.
